How do I prepare?

FREE preparation classes are available at our Center for students aged 18 or older.

Students must complete the intake/registration process set by the state for these adult education classes.

Keene Classes/Hours

Monday, 9-12 noon (Math)

Wednesday, 9-12 noon (Language Arts)

FREE and **low-cost** preparation materials are available online including a tutorial video and practice tests at

FREE study materials may be available at your local library. Study materials are also available at a cost at your local bookstore or commercial bookselling websites.

Our Center also offers HiSET practice tests every month to assess student readiness. Practice tests are \$5 a subject, and students are asked to pre-register for them.

How much time do I have to take the tests?

The HiSET is administered in two 4-hour test sessions. The complete HiSET battery consists of five subtests:

- Math — 90 minutes
- Language Arts-Writing — 120 minutes (includes an essay)
- Science — 80 minutes
- Social Studies — 70 minutes
- Language Arts-Reading — 65 minutes

How is the test scored?

In order to pass the HiSET and obtain a New Hampshire HiSET certificate, all three of the following criteria must be met:

NOTE: A perfect score for each test is 20; a perfect combined score is 100.

1. Minimum score of 8 to pass any one test. Any test with a score under 8 must be retaken.
2. Minimum score of 2 to pass the essay.
3. Total combined score of 45 or higher.

When will I get my results?

On average, official test scores for both computer- and paper-delivered tests are posted within:

- 3–5 business days for multiple-choice sections
- 6–10 business days for the essay section
- Access to computer-based scores is available on the same day as testing.

Note: The Language Arts – the Writing subtest contains both multiple-choice and essay questions. Only a combined score is reported, so scores are available within approximately 6–10 business days.

How do I get a transcript?

An unofficial transcript is available through your HiSET account and will **NOT** be sent in the mail.
